

Publishers Letter

The saying goes that "a picture is worth a thousand words." So perhaps, this issue is worth a few years' worth of words in that respect. Because I don't really call it out in the masthead, or plaster every image I make with a photo credit or watermark, you might not know that I have taken nearly every photograph in TONE since day one. I didn't start out as a writer, I was a photographer in the advertising world for nearly 20 years before starting this project, and I've been taking pictures since I was 13. When I got that first roll of film back from the lab, I knew that was what I was going to do with my life.

Many of our readers have asked us to do a coffee table book, and while that sounds fun and grandiose, we're fairly print adverse here, as you know. While TONE was a bit ahead of the curve with a PDF magazine, now that technology has caught up with my original vision, this long time print veteran would much rather read it on an iPad Pro or a 4k/5k monitor than be bound to the compressed tonal scale that ink on paper offers. In a recent editorial, Stereophile's Art Dudley (who's company I've enjoyed often) alludes to the fact that you aren't a real magazine if you aren't in print. I beg to differ. As a seasoned vet of the print world, both from behind the camera and from a couple of years spent at one of the world's finest lithography houses, helping to create million dollar printed pieces, even the best that print has to offer in terms of color gamut and dynamic range is a 320kb/sec MP3, sometimes approaching the fidelity of a red book CD — and then only when there is a seven-figure budget.

Looking at the wide color gamut of a big monitor, to me, is like looking at the rich, backlit color of an 8 x 10 inch Ektachrome transparency, on a light box, in a color corrected room. It's like listening to the master tape.

As someone who has spent their entire life making everything from toasters to Porsches look inviting, that's why I spend so much time on the photos for TONE, and hundreds of hours removing surface imperfections and dust specks from things. I love the way so much of this stuff looks, as much as it sounds, and the time that the manufacturers spend on their casework is often overlooked, or at the least, minimized. This issue is not only a self-indulgance of mine, it is a celebration of everyone in the high end audio industry, that has taken the time to put their product in something beyond a basic box. We all have different opinions on this, but I love every form of design, and enjoy owning products that are just as exciting to look at and make part of my environment, as they are to listen to.

So, for those of you that share my vision, I present TONE's first "Fine Art of Audio" issue. I hope you enjoy the pictures.

The Quad Z4 Speakers: Elegance in Form & Function

While the Quad is part of a very small handful of audio manufacturers who can boast an 80th anniversary. While the Quad 1 amplifier represented the company's first product release, most audiophiles associate Quad with their famous ESL 57 full-range electrostatic speaker, arriving on the scene 15 years later - a design remaining largely unchanged for over a quarter century. The ESL 57's modern grandchildren -- the 2812 and 2912 -- still carry a family resemblance.

Over the years, Quad added many products to their line, including the value packed Z4 floorstanding speakers we review here. At their price point of \$3,999/pair, they offer a lot of value to a listener seeking modern looks and marvelous sound.

Unlike Quad's classic electrostats, the Z4's offer a more conventional three-way, non-ported design. A ribbon tweeter nine mm wide and 120mm tall compliments the Z4's 150mm Kevlar-cone midrange. Three 165mm Kevlar woofers occupy the lower section of the cabinet, providing bass reproduction down into the 40Hz range.

While the speaker looks traditionally-shaped when viewed from the front, that perception is instantly shattered with a closer look. The cabinet features an elegantly rounded backside, complemented by a handsome swoop upward at the top-rear of the enclosure.

The curvy shape improves the speaker's aesthetics, reducing cabinet resonances for better sound. Win-win! Three colors are available: Black, white, or rosewood. Regardless of choice, the top surface offers a beautiful piano gloss which adds to the Z4's elegant presence.

The Z4s stand 1175mm tall, 267mm wide, and 340mm deep. The solidly-build cabinets weigh in at 23.5Kg. Beefy, but light enough to be managed by one person.

Unpacking

Each speaker comes in its own cardboard box, with several rings of thick foam slid down over the top of the speaker at various points for additional protection. Beneath the foam, a thick plastic sheet covers the innermost layer – a soft, white fabric cover. In a separate ziplock bag along with the instruction manual, Quad provides a nice set of white fabric gloves to help keep messy fingerprints off the shiny cabinet finish during setup. I owe Quad an apology for my finger smudges on the speakers, but the gloves were a bit slippery against the smooth cabinets. Given a choice between fingerprints and having a speaker slip out of my hands inadvertently during unpacking, the choice is easy. I keep a soft chamois cloth handy to remove my unsightly fingerprint residue.

The Z4s include spikes to better couple the speakers to your floor. While spikes are great once you find the optimal location for each speaker, I'm compelled to offer new Z4 owners some warning here. During the process of freeing the speakers from their boxes, I proceeded with my usual one-person unpacking technique of keeping the box vertical, sliding the packaged speaker out of it, then removing the rest of the protective material.

Unfortunately, that decision was the *wrong* one. Unlike other speakers I have unpacked over the years, Quad has the Z4 spikes *pre-installed*.

The lowest foam ring visually obscures the spikes, but the sharp points are there, lurking, just below the surface. As a result, "sliding" the speakers out of the box resulted in some deep and ugly scratches on the hardwood floor. Please learn from my error. Unpack the speakers upon a durable and protective surface, or alternately, lay the speakers on their side while removing them from the box.

Quad includes a package of little metal cups to place under each spike, so once the Z4s are out of the box, you can stand the speakers upright without harming the floor. Bribe a friend with beer and pizza to help you in this process!

The backside of the Z4 features four 5-way binding posts. The posts stack atop one another due to the curved cabinet shape. Banana-terminated speaker cables are an ideal partner since spade terminated cables will need to connect to the Z4 posts an angle. Gold-plated jumpers are pre-installed. However, loosening the binding posts makes removing the stamped jumpers easy if a Z4 owner chooses bi-wired cables or uses third-party jumpers.

Listening

After several days of break-in, the Quads reveal their pleasant voicing and offer a very satisfying musical picture. "Sleep Will Come" by Bliss brings together a complex mix of string instruments, accordion, percussion, and electronic effects all of which have a naturalness, and airy freedom through the Z4.

In the past, I have encountered ribbon-based designs from other manufacturers that generate ear-piercing high notes, a narrow sweet spot, or both. The Quads do not suffer from these maladies when placed optimally. Quad's ribbon tweeter design navigates the tenuous balance of detailed sound reproduction while avoiding the ear-tweaking singe. The tweeter blends in well among the other drivers giving a full, broad, and delightful sonic experience. When listening to Dave Brubeck Quartet's "Koto Song," for example, each piano note rings forth with an engaging level of attack, decay, and realism. The Z4's capability for detailed revelation could prove a double-edged sword in some scenarios. If a potential buyer's upstream audio components that lean toward stridency and sibilance, the Z4 will not hesitate to reveal those upstream artifacts.

The speakers also offer impressive soundstaging. When the Quads find an optimum location in the listening room, music projects in all directions from the speaker creating convincing, holistic, and solid images of vocalists and musicians. For example, the background voices and noises heard in "Heroes" from Kruder and Dorfmeister's *K&D Sessions* appear to emit from the wall well behind the speakers, while musical elements and voices dance upfront in accordance with the layering engineered into the recording.

While the Z4s roll-off below 40Hz, the low frequencies they do produce render with taught bass. The Z4s are a nuanced speaker. To coax more punch from them, a beefier amplifier in the 150-250 watt range will provide them the opportunity to sing to their full potential. The Z4 offers balanced reproduction, but may be a bit polite for those wanting bass monsters.

Regardless of genre, the Z4s work their best magic as all rounders. After several days of listening time, the Quads prove their mettle as a very musically-satisfying speaker with an enjoyable voice.


Long term audiophiles often joke that DAC years are like dog years. A year in digital is like forever in analog. On one level, these are computing devices, and look how far digital has advanced in over 35 years. Guess that makes it a "mature" format now, eh?

But back in the 80s and 90s, it was a new frontier for digital audio. Much like the way computers got exponentially more powerful with every release, once the major audiophile manufacturers got behind the concept of an external DAC, it was a wild ride.

Companies like Wadia, Mark Levinson, Stax, and Meridian had all jumped into the arena and were bringing every bit of technical expertise to bear – the world had finally figured out that we didn't have perfect sound forever – yet, and that bits were more than just bits.

Perhaps one of the most unlikely companies to jump in to the pool was Audio Research – a company known for analog excellence. But it was this attention to power supply and analog circuitry made for an incredible first effort. You can read Robert Harley's full review here, and feel the excitement in his words as the digital medium was growing by leaps and bounds, becoming a legitimate format. An argument that continues to this day.

Respecting HiFi's Past...

It's critical to mention, that ARC never received the respect they should in the digital department. They've always won accolades for their phono stages, preamplifiers, and power amplifiers, but not so much in the digital world. They've always made solid digital products that play in a league only a few molecules less than the world's finest. And it all started with the DAC 1.

No high res here

High resolution digital wouldn't hit the scene until nearly the end of the decade, so 16/44 (and 16/48 if you had a DAT recorder) was it. Back in 1991, I had just purchased Levinson's PDT transport and was still using my original PS Audio Digital Link for DAC duties. My system was sporting a D-79, so the DAC-1 was definitely an object of desire.

Three decades later, the bulk of my digital music collection is still 16/44, so the DAC-1 fits right in to the work flow. Borrowing my old SP-11 pre to make my all-ARC vintage system complete along

with my D79, hooking up the Magnepan Tympani IVs brings me right back to 1991.

Vintage value

\$3,500 in 1991 is equivalent to almost \$7,000 in today's currency, so that's a lot of dough today. ARC was on to something back then, and had they not joined a number of other companies to dig in, demystify, and develop this format, digital would still suck.

Clean DAC 1s are still fetching about \$700 on any given day if you can find one. I'll take a ARC DAC-1 over anything I've heard new for a thousand bucks in a heartbeat. Provided we're only talking RedBook files.

This could make a great addition to a vintage or even beginning system that doesn't require rendering high res files. And for those of you that have older transports, or budget OPPO's, the DAC 1 will prove more than worthy.

Interestingly enough, more than one touring rock band used banks of these amplifiers to drive their PA systems.

Covering this amplifier in our Old School column back in issue 8, after landing a decent 400 on EBay, the 400 still sounded quite good.

Nearly fifteen years further down the road, the remaining examples are in much less good shape, and the output transistors even harder to come by.

Best left for the hazy memories they inspired!

Fiber glass (0,04mm)

To this day, only one material permits a joining of these parameters: Beryllium. For domes with identical masses. Beryllium is seven times more rigid than Titanium or Aluminum. This results in a sound wave three times faster than Titanium and two and a half times faster than Aluminum.

ho hasn't been taken in by the warm glow of vacuum tubes, at least once during their audio journey?

Many argue that tubes bring a certain warmth to the sound reproduced, and while most of us believe that, there's still something special about those glowing bottles that feels right.

Dealers That Mean Business:

You've read all the reviews, you've argued with the internet pundits,

and you're ready to write a check. Now what? If you're a slightly used customer that likes to shop for the best bargain you can find on Audiogon, this article is not for you. And, controversial though it might sound, I'm not against Audiogon. If you want a gently pre-owned preamp, love music, and just don't want to buy new, I get that – as long as you know what you're getting into. Audiogon can be a great place to buy pre owned gear if you know exactly what you want - and don't expect ANY service. But someone has to buy it new, so you can buy it used – remember that!

If you are the customer that likes to buy new, loves the feel (and the smell) of taking it out of the box for the first time, knowing no one else has touched it, I get that too. Personally, I'm about 50/50 on this experience, as I am with cars. Ask anyone who's bought a preamp or a used car from me, it's usually pretty pampered.


However, if you are going to spring for new gear, you need a good dealer. Someone who understands you, your music and most of all your perspective. You need someone to help you find the right components that will work together as a system, help you set it up in some cases, and offer support when things don't work out as planned. There's no substitute for experience, and a great dealer knows their products, and knows what will work best for you.

Nearly every audio system that has failed to achieve the greatness expected of it can be traced back to poor component choice (system and/or room) synergy and poor component setup. I've been to hifi shows, homes, and dealers all over the world – hearing sound good, bad, and somewhere inbetween. It always boils down to these two factors if something isn't truly broken, and it rarely is.

The solution is easy. Find a great dealer. While there isn't a hifi shop on every corner like there was back in the 70s, there are still some truly great dealers out there that will help you put together a stunning music system, regardless of your budget. And I'm on a mission to find as many of them as I can for you.

I'm starting with the folks I know, in this new section of the magazine. Most of the establishments in this list are running full page ads in the magazine – and there is a caveat. I will not accept advertising in this magazine from a dealer unless I've been to their place, seen the shop and have talked to a cross section of their customers to know they provide superior service. In most cases, these are hifi shops that I, or someone on the staff has purchased gear from as well.

These are not just people wanting to buy space in TONEAudio. Every one of these dealers carry my personal endorsement, and I hope that will help you on your journey. 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
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
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
